between Israel and Hamas, the war in Ukraine, and other conflicts require our "liberating witness" (in the words of Presiding Bishop, Elizabeth Eaton.)

We can pray for people who are separated from loved ones, or who have lost loved ones. We can humbly ask God to put an end to hatred and disregard for human life, and to help all peoples and nations to live in peace.

Our contributions to St. Vincent DePaul, "Adopt-a-Family," "Come to Supper," and area food pantries help to ensure that people in Florence and surrounding areas have access to food and other necessities. Rev. Cathleen Morris called the September 20th meeting of the Session to order in the Conference Room at 4:05 p.m. and opened with prayer. Four ruling elders were present; Jan Roberts and Janell White were excused.

The minutes of the August 16, 2023 meeting of the Session, which had been e-mailed prior to the meeting, were approved..

In her Minister's Report, Pastor Cathy shared:

- We celebrated the Lord's Supper during worship on Sunday, September 3rd.
- She led worship at Florence Health Services on Friday, August 18th and September 15th.
- An evaluation form is in process for "A Summer Day at Camp".
- The Presbytery North Westerly Regional Meeting group will reconvene in the fall.
- Rev. Larry Warren's August 16th presentation, "Death and Hints of the Hereafter" was well attended and

is recorded for additional viewing.

- The "GriefShare" group is meeting on Mondays, 3:00 p.m. at First.
- The "QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer)" morning was a helpful small group discussion.
- She attended the Senior Day at Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp on Monday, September 11th. The focus was on "The Gift of Water", celebrating the lands and waters of our area.
- The September 13th "Service of Hope and Healing" had fewer in attendance this year, but was appreciated by those who did participate.
- She commuted to the Northern Great Lakes Synod Theological Conference on September 17th 19th held at Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp. A comment shared from the Conference was that online donations have become popular in churches and studies show that has resulted in increased giving. Consensus of Session was that we check into options, such as electronic giving through our local bank.
- She will be on vacation October 7th -13th. Pulpit supply is to be determined for Sunday, October 8th.
- The Tuesday morning Text Study group held here at First has resumed. She led the study on September 12th.
- A letter from the Florence County Human Services Department regarding financial assistance for a family was shared. Discussion resulted with no action taken.
- Our new Administrative Assistant, Leanne Wilcox, has been training with Barb Marden. Session agreed to adjust her schedule to full days on Monday and Tuesday and half days in the morning on Wednesday and Thursday. Office closed on Friday. The new schedule will be posted.
- The Parish thanked Barb for her years of service at a potluck luncheon at Bethlehem on Sunday, September 10th. We appreciate that she will continue to assist with the Parish budget forecasting and planning.
- Our list of volunteer duties will be posted. Thus far, we've had a volunteer who has been folding Sunday bulletins
- The Florence Elementary School is planning a Halloween, "Trunk or Treat" activity. Session agreed to participate as we did last year. Pr. Cathy will add it to the agenda for Bethlehem's Council meeting, since Parish Board will not meet until late October.

Our treasurer's report as of August 31, 2023 was reviewed, noting all balances. A CD coming due this month is to be renewed at the best rate and interval.

Our Deacons have not met since our last meeting. They continue to assist with the "Come to Supper" meals. It was noted with regret that Pat Christian has resigned as our lead person and cook for the meals. She will be missed. The next meal will be September 25th.

In Presbytery and Synod news:

Pastor Cathy and Karen reported on their attendance at the Presbytery meeting held at the First Presbyterian Church in Escanaba, MI on Saturday, September 16th.

The Property Committee update included:

The foundation of the church, backsplash area in the conference room and kitchen have been painted by Joe Kuder. A semi-gloss paint will result in easier upkeep of those areas.

The replacement window for the loft had the wrong color and kind of trim and has been reordered by St. George Glass.

Consensus was to have an annual inspection of the church furnaces. The manse furnace is new and was installed on March 1, 2023.

After discussion it was decided to leave the bulletin board in its current place as there is little available

PUMPKIN DESSERT

Ingredients:

1 yellow cake mix

1 egg

1/2 c. melted oleo

1 small can (1 C.) pumpkin

1 1/2 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

1/2 C. brown sugar

2 eggs

2/3 C. milk

1 tsp. cinnamon

1/4 C. sugar

1/4 C. oleo



Reserve 1 cup cake mix. Mix remaining cake mix, one egg and melted oleo, press into a greased 9x13" cake pan. Mix pumpkin, spice, brown sugar, eggs and milk. Pour over crust. Mix together 1 cup cake mix that was reserved, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/4 cup sugar and 1/4 cup oleo. Sprinkle over top of other mixture.
