Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the busyness of the Advent Season, it is easy to get caught up in shopping, meal planning, cookie baking, and other holiday activities. Yet, as your pastor, I would like to encourage you to focus your minds and hearts on the coming of Christ! One way you can do this, is to join in person with other parish families, or via online options, at our upcoming

Advent, Christmas and Epiphany worship services. This letter includes information about the liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany and our plans for celebrating each one!

ADVENT

"See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness. 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'" (Mark 1:2 NRSV)

Advent is a time of awaiting the coming of Christ. During the four Sundays of the Advent Season, candles are lit on the Advent wreath. The candles traditionally represent "Hope," "Peace," "Joy" and "Love."

As of the writing of this letter, there are two Sundays remaining in the Advent Season. This Sunday (December 17th), we will worship at our morning in-person services at First at 8:00 a.m. and at Bethlehem at 9:15 a.m.. Next Sunday, Christmas Eve morning (December 24th, the final Sunday of Advent), we will not have in-person worship services. Instead, we will provide you with some YouTube and website links from other churches, so that you can watch their services.

CHRISTMAS

(To the shepherds:)

"But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see--I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11, NRSV)

On <u>Christmas Eve</u>, we will celebrate the birth of Jesus, lying in the manger, surrounded by Mary, Joseph and the shepherds. We will have two services, one at <u>First at 4:00 p.m.</u>, and one at <u>Bethlehem at 6:00 p.m.</u>. Season of Advent

In the ancient world, various peoples lit fires to mark the turning of the light into winter's season and to pray for the return of the light. The church has Christianized that practice in the lighting of the Advent wreath. To us, these candles are signs of the growing light of Christ who is coming again in all fullness into the darkness of our world. Until the dawning of that Great Day, we watch and wait for Christ's coming into the darkness of our world, lighting candles of hope, peace, joy, and love; and remembering the promises of God with prayer.

Once we have more details, we will provide them in the church bulletins.

The Christmas season continues the following Sunday on New Year's Eve morning (December 31st). We will have a joint service of "Lessons and Carols" at 9:15 a.m. at First Presbyterian on that day. There will be scripture readings from the Bible and special music provided by Jan Roberts. You will be able to sing several beautiful Christmas hymns too!

If you are not in the Florence area on <u>New Year's Eve morning</u>, you are invited to watch the "Lessons and Carols" service via our Zoom link, or the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Synod of the Covenant's worship service. The Synod's service will be available on their website (synodofthecovenant.org) beginning New Year's Eve morning.

EPIPHANY

(Regarding the Magi after their meeting with King Herod:)

"When they had heard the king, they set out, and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen in the east, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." (Matthew 2:9-12, NRSV)

Epiphany is about the manifestation of Christ to the world! On the "Epiphany of Our Lord," Saturday, January 6th, the Magi, who are gentiles, pay homage to Jesus. On Sunday, January 7th, we will join together in worship at 8:00 a.m. at First, and 9:15 a.m. at Bethlehem. The Epiphany Season continues until Ash Wednesday, which is, the beginning of the Lenten Season.

We have many opportunities to celebrate the Advent, Christmas and Epiphany Seasons! Please join us in person or via online technology at these upcoming services.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President, Bob Friberg at 6:12pm. Present: Bob Friberg, Bill Fleming, Deb Fleming, Diane Theis and Pastor Cathy Morris. Absent: Mary Voelker & Connie Walther.

Opening Prayer: Pastor Cathy offered the opening prayer.

Secretary's report: Minutes from October 17th meeting were reviewed. Diane made a motion to accept the minutes as written and Bill seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Deferred until December meeting Pastor's Update:

FIRST'S SESSION NOTES

The November 15, 2023, meeting of the Session was called to order in Fellowship Hall by the Rev. Cathleen Morris, Moderator, at 3:00 p.m. and she opened with prayer. A quorum was declared with all Session members present.

A motion to approve the agenda was duly made, seconded and carried.

Steve Farone, our investment advisor from Nicolet Wealth Management, then joined us virtually via Zoom and utilizing his prepared document provided a general update on our account, noting the transfer to Charles Schwab and Co. Inc. went well. He briefly reviewed our funds and answered questions of the Session. We thanked Steve for meeting with us and plan to meet with him annually with the next meeting to be during the November 2024 meeting of the Session.

At 3:30 p.m., we returned to our meeting agenda.

Janice Roberts is our Ministry of Service person for November; Jim Gehlhoff for December.

A motion to approve the minutes of the October 18, 2023 meeting and the special meeting of October 25th was duly made, seconded and carried.

In her Minister's Report, Pastor Cathy shared:

- We celebrated our Lord's Supper during worship on Sunday, November 5th.
- She led worship at Florence Heath Services on Friday, October 20th and November 13th.
- The Presbytery North Westerly Regional Meeting group has not yet reconvened this fall.
- November 13th was the last meeting of the GriefShare program. Our thanks to Kim Richmond for once again being the facilitator.
- The October 29th, PTO "Trunk or Treat" activity was well attended.
- A delicious Harvest Dinner was enjoyed at St. Mary's Catholic Church on October 29th.
- Annette Seibold, Director of the Florence County Health Department, has shared that they are assisting the Head Start agency locally with advertising, seeking a location, and staff. A classroom may be available at the Elementary School in the fall.
- A few people have volunteered as a result of sharing our "volunteer duties" list.
- The St. Vincent de Paul "Giving Tree" items are to be returned to the church by Dec. 3rd.
- A "Dwelling in the Word" Bible Study is being held once a month at Bethlehem at about 10:30 a.m. Everyone is welcome to attend.
- Pastor Cathy and Joan Churchill have met with Stacey from "Crafters on Central" regarding the use of our kitchen and Fellowship Hall. Tentative plans are to use the facilities twice a month. In order for her to offer a children's program, volunteer help would be needed. High School students were suggested. More details are still to be discussed. Pastor Cathy asks that a committee meet with Stacey. Our fee for janitor services after use should be assessed.
- Christmas Eve services are set for 4:00 p.m. at First and 6:00 p.m. at Bethlehem. No worship services are scheduled for the morning of December 24th or Christmas Day.
- The Synod of the Covenant has decided to provide a virtual worship service for Sunday, December 31st, rather than on the 24th. Session prefers that we have a combined worship of scripture and carols, as we have done in the past, on the Sunday after Christmas. This year it would be at Bethlehem Lutheran. Time to be determined.
- Pastor Cathy will be leaving for vacation on December 25th and returning on January 2nd.
- We agreed to have our annual congregational meeting on Sunday, January 28, 2024 at noon. Refreshments to be served.
- Pastor Cathy will check with Barb Marden regarding our website.
- Consensus was that our Parish Directory be updated by mid-year.

Session then reviewed the reports submitted by our treasurer as of October 31, 2023, which included the End of the Month Account Balances, General Checking, Building Checking, and the Monthly Transaction Report.

Karen had prepared updates on our budget as of 10/31/2023 for Session's information.

Janell reported that our Deacons had met last week and will be decorating the sanctuary and entrance area on Tuesday, November 21st at 3 p.m. All are invited to the decorating time, after which a light meal will be shared. Please see their report in this issue of the newsletter.

The final "Come to Supper" meal for this year is set for November 27th. A date to resume in the spring has not been determined.

Our Parish Articles of Agreement need further revision. Pastor Cathy and Karen will work on thoughts mentioned at the recent Parish Board meeting.

Property Committee agenda items discussed:

St. George Glass has scheduled the loft window replacement for November 19th.

A recent phone call from our lift resulted in a 911 call to the Sheriff's Department, though no one was in our building. Jim offered to follow-up on the situation so the Sheriff's office has current information about our buildings, whom to contact, etc.

Jim also will reprogram our thermostats as the temperatures are fluctuating in each zone.

The trash collection in the town will be changing in 2024. As a tax-exempt property, we are asked to complete a form for the church and manse. Karen will submit that.

Installation of a mirror in the entrance, which would allow our office staff to see those coming into the building, will be considered.

Jim suggested calling the phone company regarding moving the internet cable which could allow sharing of the internet between the manse and church office.

In Presbytery News, Karen shared that persons interested in applying for the vacated position of Stated Clerk of Presbytery are to submit a letter of interest. Those applicants then will be on a ballot for election at a meeting of the Presbytery.

The next meetings of the Session were set for 3:00 p.m. Wednesday, December 13th and Wednesday, January 10th.


The Parish Board will meet on Wednesday, December 6th at 6:00 p.m.

PECAN MELTAWAYS

Ingredients:

1 cup butter, softened 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 2-1/4 cups all purpose flour 1/4 teaspoon salt 3/4 cup chopped pecans Additional confectioners' sugar

(Recipe from Taste of Home. Picture from jettskitchen.com.)



Directions: In a large bowl, cream butter and confectioners' sugar until light and fluffy, 5-7 minutes. Beat in vanilla. Combine flour and salt; gradually add to creamed mixture and mix well. Stir in pecans. Refrigerate until chilled.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Roll into 1-inch balls and place on ungreased baking sheets. Bake 10-12 minutes or until set. Roll warm cookies in additional confectioners' sugar; cool completely on wire racks. Roll cooled cookies again in confectioners' sugar. Yield: 4 dozen

2023
